What is Bullying?

Bullying is a form of aggressive, harassing and manipulative behavior, that is severe, persistent or pervasive with a deliberate intent to hurt, embarrass, or humiliate another person. It can take many forms: verbal, physical, gestures or expressions, and electronic. No child deserves to be bullied and no child should bully another. The best protection parents can offer their child is to foster confidence and self-esteem. Talking openly about respect for self and others will increase tolerance for differences.

What should parents do?

When parents suspect that repeated acts of bullying are taking place, it should be reported to school staff.

If the investigation finds that bullying behavior has occurred, it will result in prompt and appropriate disciplinary action. This may include loss of privileges, detention, suspension, and possible expulsion for students. (School Board Policy No. 249)

Cyberbullying that takes place out of school should be reported to the local police department.

What should students do?

Victims can report bullying at school to teachers, the Director, other staff, or Safe2Say anonymous reporting.

- Talk with your parents
- Ignore the bully or don't react
- Walk away
- Be assertive, but do not get into a physical or verbal altercation
- Hold your head up, show confidence in yourself
- Use humor
- Stick with a friend on the bus, when changing classes and at lunch time

Witnesses to bullying—report to school staff or Safe2Say anonymous reporting, and encourage the victim to do the same.

- Support the victim
- Tell the bully to stop
- Do not laugh or side with the bully
- Don't confront the bully if you think someone may get hurt
